PRINCIPAL'S ADDRESS

Dear Parents and Caregivers

A busy week at Walpole PS this week! NAPLAN student reports have arrived for distribution and staff have had the opportunity to study the results. Although NAPLAN is a one-off test it does provide very valuable information to the school for planning purposes. It lets us see how we are going compared to the Australian average and to other 'like' schools. importantly it provides a detailed review of student achievement for every tested item so teachers can see who needs what specific help. Overall the results for this school were very encouraging with maths showing encouraging results for both Yr 3 and Yr 5, likewise in reading again for both Yr 3 and Yr 5. In writing Yr 3 students performed very well and Yr 5 are showing improvement which is beyond the achievement of similar schools. When there are less than 10 students in a year level as is the case at Walpole PS, individual results can skew averages either way quite significantly so bear that in mind if you are researching the schools results on the My School website.

Overall I would think parents should be very happy with the learning opportunities provided in a small school with low numbers in each class providing more opportunities for individualised learning assistance.

This week saw the Room 4 students involved in the "Write a Book in a Day" project which they enjoyed and which was very productive. Students enjoyed dressing up as their favourite character to celebrate Book Week.

Two teams of students worked on two stories "Stranded" and "Mastermind Missy". Nine students each had to

write a chapter, illustrate their chapter and ensure that the story line and characters were consistent and plausible; that appropriate tense was maintained; characters developed and the plot upheld. Finally the book is bound, title and author, cover and chapter outlines sorted and printed – all in a day! Great Effort and congratulations to every student in Room 4.

The final products are entered into a competition and copies are available in both the town and school libraries and in children's hospital libraries.


We have also had an assembly hosted by Room 4 students, followed by a parent morning tea and an art exhibition in Room 1. Great Stuff!
